The Importance of Place and the Feast of St. John Lateran – Humans, having both body and soul, are both spiritual and material; therefore, place matters for us. While animals have memory of places and interact with their surroundings via instinct, human beings go far beyond that and can find meaning in places. Emotions and historical or theological importance may be associated with a place. Think about what these places conjure in your mind and soul: Normandy, Gettysburg, Tiananmen Square, Venice, Weston, Touhy, Lincoln. And what about Rome, Jerusalem, Eden? Furthermore, landmarks in places tell of meaning as well: St. John Nepomucene or St. Vitus Church, etc. In Letters to a Young Catholic by George Weigel each chapter associates a place and its history with some lesson of Catholic faith and culture: a grave of a modernday martyr in Warsaw, The Eagle and Child Pub in Oxford, the Sistine Chapel in Rome. This Sunday we celebrate an important place and its historical and spiritual importance. St. John Lateran is one of the four major basilicas in Rome. You would think that St. Peter's Basilica (which is built over the tomb and bones of St. Peter) would be considered the Pope's main church. While St. Peter's is important for many reasons and where many events happen, it is St. John Lateran that is officially the Pope's Cathedral. While the pope's authority comes from Christ himself: "You are Peter and upon this rock I will build my church...." (Matthew 16), yet St. John's Lateran is the place associated with the Pope exercising his Godgiven authority as Christ's visible representative on earth. Its name is officially Cathedral of the Most Holy Savior and Saint John the Baptist and Saint John the Evangelist in Lateran. Lateran is the name of the Hill it is on, donated to the Pope by the Laterani family. Therefore, written on the façade of St. John Lateran is "Mother and head of all the churches in the city and the world." This is one of many important places of our faith and worth celebrating.

St. Faustina's Purgatory Vision - During a vision from God, Saint Faustina spoke with souls in Purgatory. She wrote about her experience, saying, "I asked these souls what their greatest suffering was. They answered me in one voice that their greatest torment was longing for God." [These souls cannot enter heaven until they are perfected]. She also saw Mary tending to these souls, "I saw Our Lady visiting the souls in purgatory. The souls call her 'The Star of the Sea.' She brings them refreshment." Let us pray for the souls in purgatory. We will want others to pray for us if we are there. In November we especially emphasize praying for the holy souls in purgatory.
