

NOTES FROM FR. VANDEWALLE

25th Sunday Readings Reflection from *Magnificat* Periodical - What is most striking about the landowner is the relentless way he himself goes out to find laborers, his constant willingness to hire the ones who are still standing there, and his desire to pay them a full day's wage. Jesus tells us that the kingdom of heaven is like this landowner. God takes the initiative in seeking us out. God chooses us despite our utter unworthiness. And God is lavish in his self-gift to us. To love the kingdom of heaven is to love this landowner and the way he acts. The temptation is for us to measure our life by what we imagine we deserve. But in truth, God is always giving us far more than we deserve, even in calling us to labor in his kingdom! Let us 'seek the lord while he may be found, call him while he is near,' because, for us, 'life is Christ." (Magnificat)

25th Sunday Readings from Fr. Vandewalle – "My thoughts are not your thoughts," says the first reading. Fortunately, God sees the whole picture of life and history, set up for our good. And yet, at the same time, God shares with us the mystery so we can understand His plan more and more, if our minds and hearts are open. The kingdom is both now and later. We get glimpses now, we work now, we trust now. Later, we shall see fully, how good God was to us. Hopefully, we work to notice this now. Paul in the second reading had the tension of this 'now' and 'later,' a conflict of where he wanted to be, in heaven already or – for the sake of God and the people – to continue working and suffering for their benefit on earth. On the summer New Mexico Mission trip, a dad-driver asked those high school students in his van, "If God told you, you could go to heaven right now or remain on earth, what would you choose?" The kids' answers were interesting and full of faith and honesty. Finally, the Wages in the Parable could only be the same for all, because the Father's Gift to us is the Son, and one cannot give more than the Most.
